

Course Title: A Spiritual Guide to Authorship

Class Meets: Online

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Course Description:

This online course will explore Spiritual strategies for producing one of the greatest stories untold (your story) which aligns with the structure of THE Greatest Book EVER Written (The Bible).

Students will:

- Pay close attention to how our desires should align with the will of God.
- Develop writing goals that are easy to attain.
- Practice a full-proof method to eliminating procrastination.
- Destroy negative habits that have stifled the writer’s progress.
- Learn that failure is an illusion (there is no failure in God).
- Have all of the necessary steps for developing a completed manuscript.

<p>Foreword: Correlation between <i>History</i> Books (2 weeks)</p>	<p>The history books of the Bible include books from Joshua through Esther.</p> <p>In summary, these books cover the history of everything from the Israelites pressing “forward” from the yoke of bondage brought on by Pharaoh, Moses’ death, conquering the promised land, and God designating Judges to lead His people.</p> <p>Bible Correlation/Writing Topic:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We will establish how to overcome/conquer obstacles that challenge writing creativity and challenge the student to press forward. <p>Writing Deliverable:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The intent, purpose and creation of the foreword <p>Best Practice: Expose the Fear</p>
<p>Dedication: Correlation with <i>Wisdom & Poetry</i> books (2 weeks)</p>	<p>The <i>Wisdom & Poetry</i> books consist of Job, Psalms, Proverbs and Songs of Solomon.</p> <p>These books are known to address the human heart and provide a vivid description of real-life experiences and how people respond to those experiences spiritually.</p> <p>Bible Correlation/Writing Topic:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Dedication should demonstrate how to express gratitude from the heart. <p>Writing Deliverable:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Intent, purpose and preparation of the dedication. <p>Acknowledgements: Correlation with the Epistles</p> <p>References: Correlation with Revelation</p> <p>(2 weeks)</p>	<p>The Epistles of the Bible are referred to as the letters to the Christian churches and are outlines from Romans – Jude.</p> <p>Letters are written communication.</p> <p>Bible Correlation/Writing Topic</p> <p>In this lesson, we learn that acknowledgments are written letters to thank those people who receive credit for their contribution.</p> <p>Intent, Purpose and Process References reveal the sources you have used, allowing the reader to easily find what you have cited.:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Intent, Purpose and Process • Proper Citation
